## Attendance/Tardies

Attendance: For your student to get the most out of their instruction here at LNE we expect all students to be in class, on time, every day. While this is the expectation, we do know that things come up. If you know your student will be absent from school, you may call our Attendance Office at anytime of the day. If you are calling outside of office hours, please leave a message including your students name, student ID number and reason for the absence. If you do not have your student's ID number, please spell your students first and last name. If you

are calling during office hours you may also get the voicemail. We are a large school and have one attendance secretary who is getting attendance calls all day. *If you need your student out in the middle of the school day, please give at least one hour of notice.* We understand that emergencies happen, and we are happy to work with you in those situations. If you see an error in your student's attendance, please don't hesitate to call us so we can fix it. **The Attendance Office can be reached at (402) 436 – 1303 option #1.** 

**LNE Tardy Policy:** <u>Students with 3 or more tardies (periods 1-7) daily, will automatically</u> <u>be assigned a detention/consequence.</u> This is a change from previous years and we appreciate your support as we implement this new policy.

# **New Parking Policy**

As we get closer to starting our 2019-2020 school year, it is time to start thinking about student transportation. For our student drivers, our number one goal is to provide a safe, orderly and positive parking experience for all our students. As a result, LNE is making important changes to our parking policy\* that will go in to effect at the beginning of 1<sup>st</sup> semester (August 2019).

#### **New Parking Policy:**

- 1. To be eligible to park in the LNE Student "Green" Lot, each 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grade student must purchase a 2019-2020 parking permit for \$5.00. *Students who have fines or fees will not be eligible to purchase a parking permit until they are resolved*.
- 2. Parking permits will be available to all 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grade students ONLY.
- 3. **Again, purchasing a student parking permit does NOT guarantee your student a spot.** The student parking lot is first come first served. Purchasing a parking pass is an agreement between the student and the school to follow all LNE parking rules and regulations as laid out in the LNE student handbook. Students should plan accordingly to arrive at school with enough time to find parking. We will not excuse late arrivals because of a parking issue.
- 4. Students may only park in the designated Student "Green" Lots. These lots will be clearly marked with new signs reflecting our policy change.

#### Consequences for violating the LNE parking policies:

- 1. On the 1<sup>st</sup> violation, a written warning will be placed under the windshield wiper of the vehicle in violation. This written notice will serve as the *only* warning to the vehicle's driver. The vehicle license plate # will be recorded in the LNE Main Office.
- 2. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> violation, the owner will receive a parking ticket for \$10. All parking fines can be paid in the Bookkeeper's office during regular school hours.
- 3. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> violation, the violating vehicle will be towed from the LNE parking lot, <u>at vehicle</u> <u>owner's expense</u>. The cost to retrieve a vehicle from the impound lot at Capital Towing ranges from \$110 to \$140.

To enforce permit parking in the student "Green" lot, we have been given permission by district administration to tow vehicles that are in violation of LNE parking rules and regulations. Over the summer break, district officials will install new signage, informing of this parking policy change.

## **Temporary ID Fines**

All LPS High School Students are required to wear their student ID while they are in school. For LNE students, wearing their Student ID is a part of our expectation to keep all students "Safe", a broader part of our overall R.I.S.E. expectations. To help support this expectation we will implement a \$1.00 charge for students who require a temporary ID for the school day. *Please see our Student Handbook for further details of this change and/or other Student ID policies*.

# **Student Entrances**

To streamline our morning security check-in, students will no longer be allowed to enter through the West doors. Students are expected to enter through Main Entrance Door # 1 or through Commons Entrance Door # 35. To keep all our students "Safe" as part of our broader R.I.S.E. expectations, students are NOT to let other students or outside guests in through other doors in the school. Students found doing so will be referred to an LNE administrator.

# **Online Forms**

To make updating your student's information more efficient, LPS is moving more required forms online. This year the Student Census form and Fee-Waiver forms will be available online for parents to access and complete.

**Student Census Form:** Starting July 15th, parents and guardians will verify their child(ren)'s enrollment information through the online parent portal, ParentVUE. This

annual process was formerly completed on a paper census form, which parents/guardians had to review, update and return to the office. We recommend to all parents that they make sure their ParentVue accounts are set-up and ready to go before the start of the year.

ParentVUE is a secure, private website through Lincoln Public Schools that allows families access to their student's real-time information. ParentVUE allows you to track attendance, see class websites, view report cards, access Special Education documents, access schedules, grade book information, course history and more! ParentVUE is even available in a convenient mobile application so you can have access to your student's information right on your phone. *For more information or for help getting started please contact the LNE main office*.

**Electronic Fee Waiver:** Students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunches are generally provided a fee waiver or are provided the necessary materials or equipment without charge. The District will generally furnish students with specialized equipment and attire for participation in extracurricular activities and for use of a musical instrument in optional music courses that are not extracurricular activities. Participation in a free-lunch program or reduced-price lunch program is not required to qualify for a fee waiver. *Students or their parents must request a fee waiver prior to participating in or attending the activity, and prior to purchase of the materials, and the fee waiver must be submitted prior to the time the fee is due or the time the specialized equipment or attire is needed.* 

The fee waiver is completed electronically and will be available **July 1**<sup>st</sup> under Popular Pages on the homepage of the district website, www.lps.org, under the Free/Reduced Lunch link. A paper application is available in school offices for individuals unable to access the online application. Additional information concerning fee waivers, including what items are covered by the waiver, is available in the Important Information Handbook or by calling the LNE main office (402-436-1303, opt 2) and asking for Sandra Ourada, to assist you.

Fee Waivers are based on your Free and Reduced Meal Program Application status. Free and Reduced Meal Applications do not carry over form one year to the next. You will need to submit a 2019-20 Free and Reduced Meal Program application, available on line using the LPS website after July 22.

# LNE Honors Convocation

The LNE Honors Convocation is a time to honor our students who have qualified for Honor Roll, 4.0 GPA, earned an Academic Letter or have made Perfect Attendance. In the fall of each year, LNE will honor 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> graders ONLY, as 9<sup>th</sup> graders have not yet had an opportunity to earn final grades at LNE. In the spring, LNE will honor 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, & 11<sup>th</sup> graders. Graduates, including 12<sup>th</sup> grade early

grads and 11<sup>th</sup> grade early grads, are honored at a Senior Honors Award Ceremony in May.

# **Academic Recognition Information**

<u>Honor Roll</u>: Students must have earned a weighted G.P.A. of a 3.5 or above for the semester. Students must have at least 25 hours of GRADED (receiving a letter grade, not S) course work per semester. Students who receive an INC, U, or F in any class that semester are not eligible.

<u>Academic Letter:</u> Students need 2 consecutive semesters of a 4.0, or better, weighted G.P.A. The G.P.A. is based on grades from those individual semesters, not a student's cumulative G.P.A. Students must have at least 25 hours of GRADED (receiving a letter grade, not S) course work per semester. Students who receive an INC, U, or F in any class that semester are not eligible.

**4.0**: Students must have earned a weighted G.P.A. of a 4.0 or above for the semester. The G.P.A. is based on grades from the individual semester, not a student's cumulative G.P.A. Students must have at least 25 hours of GRADED (receiving a letter grade, not S) course work per semester. Students who receive an INC, U, or F in any class that semester are not eligible.

<u>Class Rank (top 3%) – Seniors ONLY:</u> The class ranking system that is used in the Lincoln Public Schools is based on a point system, not merely on grade point average alone. Students receive value points for classes that they have taken that reflect the grade, credits, and the difficulty of the class. Once district office has run the rank report, Northeast personnel will multiply each grade's class size by .03 to determine the number of students within the top 3% of their class. In case of a tie, all students with equal class rank will be included.

\*Effective for the class of 2021, the Laude Latin model will be used to recognize academic excellence at the conclusion of a student's high school career. Students will work to compete against the criterion for academic honors – rather than other students.

**Perfect Attendance:** Perfect Attendance is awarded to those students with no absences or tardies for the entirety of the semester.

# Rocket Academic Clubs

Northeast High School offers a variety of clubs and activities designed to stimulate the minds of students. The following clubs and activities are sponsored by Steve Eckman, and they can be joined at any time before or during the school year. **Math Club** exists so students can discover new topics in mathematics. We take part in competitions both in-school and out-of-school; some of which are at colleges and universities. Students can participate in contests, win scholarships and awards at contests and even earn a letter in Mathematics. Math Club also looks great on a college application.

Academic Decathlon is the premier academic competition in the United States. Students compete against others at their academic level. The contests include mathematics, language and literature, science, art, music, economics and social science. Materials are provided to students and learning is primarily independent study. Academic Decathlon can be taken for class credit; five credit hours are given to those who participate for the season. Scholarships are available, and this club greatly enhances a college application.

**Quiz Bowl** is a club where students answer questions from all academic topics by using a buzzer system. Speed and accuracy are critical here, and students really enjoy the competitive spirit. Northeast has won several quiz bowls over the years resulting in scholarship opportunities, awards and a trip to a national competition in Chicago over the summer.

# **Nutrition Services**

Northeast Food Service will serve breakfast from 7:30 a.m. to 7:50 a.m. in The Commons. Breakfast Grab, Go, Learn! For the 2019-20 school year, breakfast will be served in a bag! Students will have the choice of selecting either a cold breakfast (e.g. cereal) or a hot breakfast (e.g. mini pancakes).

In addition to the entrée, students will receive 100% fruit juice, low fat milk and are given the option of choosing a half cup serving of fruit. This is a good way to start your day!

Type A lunches offered are:

Type A "Hot" Lunch consists of a choice of up to two main dishes, a choice of two salads and vegetables, and bread when needed. (ex: Type A "Hot" Lunch will include one main dish, a choice of two sides (potatoes are considered a side dish), a vegetable, bread when needed and milk. # **Check This Out!**

This year, parents will be able to make all purchases online prior to Rocket Ready Days!

Beginning July 22<sup>nd</sup>, parents will be able to access all Rocket Ready Days fees on their student's Fee Profile on ParentVue. Click on the "Fee" tab located in the ParentVue menu on the left side of your screen to display all fines/fees for your student. (The fees marked optional will drop off after the start of the school year.) Then click the "cart" button at the top of the page and add your fees to your cart. Then click the SchoolPay link to enter your payment information. Any questions regarding accessing and using SchoolPay should be directed to SchoolPay by calling 888-886-9729.

We will also accept cash, check or credit card at our Rocket Ready Days Pay Station. If you are sending a check with your child, you only need to send **ONE CHECK** with the total amount of what you are purchasing.

\*\*Lifetouch orders are NOT available on ParentVue but may be ordered in advance on Lifetouch.com using our school Picture ID# located on the Lifetouch Order Form sent home.

# **Chromebook FAQ:**



How will students be held accountable for the responsible use of the device? Will insurance be provided in the event of damage, loss, or theft?

• Parents/guardians and students will be required to sign a Parental Acknowledgement of Instructional Technologies in LPS Secondary Classrooms (PA) before the device can be taken off site.

• Parents/guardians will have the option to enroll in an LPS Chromebook Assurance Program designed to protect students and families from full financial responsibility for device repairs and/or replacement. Participation in the program is optional.

#### What if a student's device is damaged?

• A process for reporting damage via electronic form will be communicated to students and parents. A temporary "loaner" device will be checked out to the student while their device is repaired. A fine will be assessed for necessary repairs based solely on the cost of the parts required to return the device to a working condition. Details of fines associated with parts is listed on the LPS website.

#### How will devices be protected when being transported between home and school and between classes?

• A protective sleeve with a hard liner and handle will be provided for transporting the device between home and school and between classes. It is an expectation that the student device will remain in the protective sleeve when not in use. This sleeve will not replace a student backpack as there will be room only for the device inside. The protective sleeve is designed to fit in a typical student backpack along with some books and materials. While the sleeve and backpack work well together, the student's backpack is NOT a substitute for the protective sleeve.

#### Will access to the Internet be filtered or monitored while off-network?

• Student devices are subject to the LPS Internet filter both on and off the LPS network. In other words, web pages viewed on the Chromebook are filtered by LPS no matter where the Chromebook is used.

# Is the Internet (wired or wireless) required to use the Chromebooks? What about students who don't have access to the Internet from home?

- Students may check out internet hot spots through their counselors that will allow internet access on their Chromebooks at home.
- Many Google and Chrome applications (including Google Drive, Docs, Sheets, and Slides) allow for offline access. This will allow a student to work offline and sync to the network drive as soon as they have network access.
- Offline access (either by way of a Chrome app or files on the device) has been and will continue to be an important consideration in the selection of digital curriculum resources.
- LPS Curriculum Specialists, school administrators, and teachers will endeavor to include opportunities for students to access curriculum content and complete assignments regardless of Internet access.
- LPS is actively engaging the Lincoln community in conversations about ways to provide Internet access in public locations throughout the city including public libraries.

# Will students be able to bring / use their own computer (from home) instead of the district-assigned Chromebook while at school?

• Chromebooks provide a balance of focus, flexibility, and manageability. Providing Chromebooks for all students ensures a consistent computing environment, including district management of user settings and classroom management software (Hapara). It is for those reasons that students should use the district-issued Chromebook while at school.

# LNE Counseling Summer Challenge!

Freshmen, Sophomores & Juniors: Log as many community service and volunteer hours as possible. Use EducationQuest's Activity Resume to keep track of how many hours and where you volunteer. Get a summer job related to a career field in which you are interested. Consider which school activities, clubs, or athletics you want to join this next school year.

Seniors: Complete 15 community service hours for GOPO, and then some! Go on a couple of campus visits and envision your senior year being your very best academic year ever at LNE! Use EducationQuest's Junior/Senior Timeline to plan steps for your future.

**Planning Ahead:** A letter will be mailed home mid-July explaining the steps to view 2019-2020 student schedules in Synergy. Beginning July 24<sup>th</sup>, students will be able to view their schedule in Synergy.

Schedule Change Opportunities: All schedule changes are recommended before school begins. # 2019-2020 Athletic/Activity Participation Packet Instructions

The Nebraska School Activities Association requires each student (Grades 9-12) who participates in any of the NSAA sanctioned Athletic or Activity programs, including Unified Sports, Cheer and Dance, to annually have a Parent and Student Consent Record completed and Physical Examination on file. **Physical examinations** (dated May 1, 2019 or after) and Parent and Student Consent Record are required to be on file in the LNE Athletics & Activities Office before the athlete may check out equipment or participate in any practice sessions. Physicals and the Participation Packet need only be completed <u>once for the entire school year</u>. You must have <u>all</u> fines cleared before you may participate in each new season. Fine payments are made in Room 102 to Mrs. VanEngen. Uniforms and equipment must be returned to the respective coach. Please encourage your athletes to complete these forms and address all fines as soon as possible rather than waiting until the first day of practice.

\*\*A physical is not required for NSAA Speech, Debate, One-Act Play Production, Journalism and Music participants.

To complete the Athletic/Activity Participation Packet process electronically you must have a Google Account. If you already have an account or once you have set one up, then you will be able to begin. **You should wait to begin the electronic packet until you have the physical form to upload** then go to the website listed below to complete the online parent consent (Step 3). There, you may upload a clear picture of your physical form that is dated on or after May 1, 2019. (Taking a picture with your cell phone will also work to upload as long as it is clear enough to read), you may email the physical to <u>ctyrrel@lps.org</u>, or bring in a hard copy if you have problems uploading it. Once Step 3 is completed, parents will need to be logged completely out before students can log in to complete the student consent (Step 4). They can also do it on their chrome book or smartphone. They need to use their school email (<u>xxxxx@class.lps.org</u>). All forms are in effect for the entire school year. ### Athletic Passes

For the 2019-2020 school year, high school students (only) will be able to purchase a **\$35.00 Athletic Pass** at the same time their student ID is being printed. An icon, universal for all LPS high schools, indicating they have purchased an athletic pass will be placed on the ID card. Students who purchase their pass at the time their ID picture is taken would need only show the ID for admittance to all LPS sponsored athletic events for the 2019-20 school year. (These athletic passes are not good for Conference, District or State Contests or events such as school plays or concerts.) Students may <u>request a fee waiver</u> for the **\$35.00 Athletic Pass** and will need to fill out a fee waiver form, available online or in the LNE Main Office.

<u>Ten punch tickets will also be available for \$20.00</u>; these are not replaceable if lost or stolen. One time use tickets are \$4.00 per student.
